Invasive Species

These are just some of the invasive species in our area!



Common Name: Phragmites (Common Reed Grass)
Scientific Name: Phragmites australis australis

- Perennial (reoccurring) grass
- Up to 20 feet tall
- Fluffy flower heads
- Displaces native plants
- Changes water flow/levels
- Blocks sunlight to aquatic communities

Common Name: European Frog-bit Scientific Name: Hydrocharis morsus-ranae Info:

- Looks like a small water lily
- Round, heart-shaped leaves
- Small white flower
- Forms thick mats that make movement hard
- Can suffocate fish and other water creatures





Common Name: Japanese Knotweed Scientific Name: Fallopia japonica

Info:

- Dense growing shrub
- Up to 10 feet tall
- Small greenish-white flowers
- Likes to grow in disturbed areas
- Displaces native plants
- Spread via rhizomes (special roots) and seeds

Common Name: Japanese Barberry Scientific Name: Berberis thunbergii Info:

- Up to 8 feet tall
- Bright red berries
- Pale yellow flowers clustered
- Likes a variety of habitats
- Still widely used in landscaping
- Paddle-shaped leaves





Common Name: Round-leaf Bittersweet Scientific Name: Celastrus orbiculatus Info:

- Perennial climbing vine
- Can grow up to 60 feet long
- Small greenish-white flowers
- Bright red berries
- Likes to grow in disturbed areas
- Can girdle and kill large trees
